



## Pump Station Rehabilitation Project

Work crews will be in your neighborhood during the next three months as part of an ongoing program to rehabilitate older pump stations in the Hillsborough County Public Utilities Department wastewater distribution system.

### What To Expect During Construction

The Public Utilities Department has hired an independent contractor to complete the work. Here is what can be expected:

Generally, a pump station rehabilitation can be completed in approximately three months. This timeframe may be adjusted depending on conditions encountered during the construction.

Most construction will take place on weekdays between 7 a.m. and 4 p.m.

The work will involve heavy equipment and excavation, and will generate normal construction noise. The station's electric pumps will be disconnected and replaced with a diesel unit during the construction. This pump will cycle on intermittently, during periods of high flow. The contractor will take steps to dampen the diesel pump noise.

In some areas, traffic lane closures may be necessary.

For the safety of the workers, other motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists, please observe all traffic control measures.

Most construction will be on County property or in the right of way. All areas affected by the construction will be restored.

In most cases, water and wastewater service will be available throughout the construction. In a few instances, it may be necessary to temporarily interrupt water or wastewater service to complete the work. Whenever possible, customers will be notified in advance. Also, any excavation work can cause an accidental pipeline break or similar problem. In the event of a water pipeline break, instructions for a precautionary boil water notice will be delivered as required by the Hillsborough County Health Department.
